- Will elders payments be included in the plan?
- How do we handle inflation?
- How do we handle budgeting?
- How do we handle various authorities?
- Whether or not the Tribe will pursue a constitution?
- We need an investment policy.
- We need to have a charitable donation policy if we are donating to charities.
- How do we handle donations to local governments?
- We need an appeals board and process.
- What laws federal and tribal that would affect the RAP Plan?
- How does a RAP Plan affect future loans for growth?
- There are various resolutions that will need to be drafted.
- We need to make sure language is clearly defined in the definitions.
- Whether any per capita payments, if any, would be monthly, annually or bi-annually.
- What are the procedures for tribal members to opt out of any per capita payments?
- How do per capita payments affect Pell grants for college?

- We need to notify tribal members of tax liability.
- How will a per capita payment, if any, affect those that receive
   DHS assistance, housing assistance, Social Security, etc.,
- How will the Tribe handle per capita payments, if any, for those that are incarcerated
- How does it affect all programs?
- How does the Tribal General Welfare Exclusion Act applies to those programs versus per capita payments?
- How do we define the fiscal year calculations? Calendar vs. fiscal.
- How do we handle having court appointed family members of the minor accounts or those that have been declared incompetent.
- What are the potential tax issues?
- How do we handle minor trust accounts?
- How do we handle deceased accounts?
- How do we handle addresses unknown?
- How do we handle child support?
- Do we put restrictions on those turning 18 to go to school?

# THINGS TO CONSIDER BY TRIBAL MEMBERS & NATIVE PEOPLE

- Do we have all the tribal healthcare we need?
- ▶ Do we have all the elder programs we need?
- ▶ Do we have all the child development we need?
- ▶ Is everyone is doing their part to keep tradition alive?
- Are Tribal members giving to their own communities enough to where per caps didn't matter?
- Would people be able to use it as a crutch or depend on it?
- ▶ It's a good thing, if the Tribe can afford to do it.
- ▶ It's good in that it could help in a time of need.
- ▶ It's bad in that it some will come to expect it and it may not always be possible to provide to our people.
- ► The people that get assistance now will still be asking for help the month after a per cap is given.
- ▶ Bottom line, we won't ever be able to please everyone.
- As long as we take care of our elders and kids, especially with health and education programs, that's good.

- ► How much is allowed?
- ► How much is enough?
- A per cap benefits those that don't live in Anadarko or the service areas.
- Car tags are good, health card is good, education assistance is great, but after that services are reduced if you don't live near the tribe.
- Some don't use social services or any of the programs really so in many cases a per capita payment would benefit them.
- If a per capita was issued during the end of the year then it could ease up on programs.
- Some don't ask for help through programs because every time in the past they were given the same answer-out of funding.
- A per cap is currently non-existent. Not just for our Tribe but for many Tribes.

## THINGS TO CONSIDER-TRIBAL PEOPLE COMMENTS

- It's a good idea because it is a way for all tribal members no matter their income or age or location to benefit from our success.
- Right now only certain groups of people benefit from the tribally funded programs.
- It's good to take care of the kids and elders and those who have hard times and low income, but it would be awesome if all tribal members could see some of that.
- > Everyone could use some extra money here and there.
- Extra money could hurt those on income based programs its taxable income and you'll have to report it as income.
- Everyone needs to be informed of the pros and cons that way people can make an educated choice on the matter
- > We need to pray that we are doing the right thing for all of our people.
- What program budgets will be affected by this?
- Can a per capita come from a different source?
- We need to make sure our programs don't suffer and the services these programs offer aren't cut off or cut back.
- > All of the information possible needs to be presented to the people.
- > It is not a black and white question.

- > It is not just "Do you want a per cap?"
- What is good for everyone and not our own needs?
- > Use the money to continue to be self sufficient and independent from federal government funding.
- > People think that tribes help certain families more than other families just cause of their stature in the tribe.. so at least everyone will get it...fair distribution..
- > People get reliant on it an feel that it's owed to them.
- > It would help elders close to or in retirement.
- > It would help people that are incarcerated who rely on limited outside resources.
- > Elders may enjoy it while they are still with us.
- > It would give a sense of pride to our people.
- Monthly could be better than lump sum depending on cost.
- Some people work and wouldn't depend on it but would enjoy;
- A per cap will give every tribal member something to call theirs.
- > We need to be self sufficient.
- > It could get out of control and end up more fighting among the people.

### THINGS TO CONSIDER-TRIBAL PEOPLE COMMENTS

- It should be the last step of a Revenue Allocation Plan.
- > If there is plenty of revenue and not just a couple of casinos,
- We don't want to cause our government to go into a deficit, have to lay off workers or let other programs suffer for a one time per year per cap.
- > It would be very beneficial to all tribal members financially.
- How does it affect Social Security payments ... it has affected other seniors with other tribes that made per capita payments.
- Need to consider minor accounts, interest, tracking interest, when payments are made, selecting a bank, etc.
- > We only have one casino in operation.
- Are all businesses operating in the black?
- Are all loans paid off?
- Are all investors paid?
- A lot of pros and cons.
- A lot of research needs to be done.
- What other tribes have per capita payments?
- How do per capita payments affect social issues such as drug abuse, alcoholism, etc.?

- Does Per Capita=Investment?
- Does Investment = Growth?
- Some tribal members would be happy with any amount.

## FINAL THINGS TO CONSIDER

- Do we want to invest in other programs instead?
  - All of the things discussed in the Strategic Planning?
  - > Programs that benefit more people?
    - > Loan program for auto
    - > Loan program for mortgage
    - Personal loans if tribal members need financial assistance.

    - > Invest in Tourism
    - > Housing-More options
    - Reinvesting in the Tribe
